JOB DESCRIPTION:

About us

For over twenty years, Quest for Learning has been supporting the educational engagement and attainment of disadvantaged Oxfordshire children. We are passionate about playing our part in closing the attainment gap between rich and poor, by working in partnership with local primary schools to provide literacy and numeracy interventions that complement their own work.

We work with primary schools that have identified children who are falling behind in reading or maths and who would benefit from our one-to-one or group programmes. In particular we support: children in Year 2 who are struggling to become readers, through our ReadingQuest programme; children in Key Stage 2 through our BookQuest programme, who can decode but whose reading comprehension is low and may lack motivation to engage with books; and children across both Key Stages who lack confidence in numeracy, whose skills in mental maths are limited, and who struggle with number facts and flexible number work.

The majority of our tutors combine working for Quest for Learning with other professional or personal commitments and value the flexibility to set their own working hours in agreement with the partner school. Most of our tutors continue to work with us after completing their initial assignments, either in the same or new partner schools.

About the role

In 2014, we launched NumSkills, a game-based maths resource that our Numeracy Tutors use with pupils struggling with mental maths. The games are linked directly to the Maths National Curriculum. Close liaison between partner schools and Quest for Learning ensures that teaching focuses on those areas where the individual pupils most need support.

Numeracy Tutors will work during school hours with pupils identified by partner schools, in groups of four. The role of the Numeracy Tutor is to increase individual children's strategies, confidence, knowledge and skills in mental maths to enable them to be successful, independent learners. Numeracy Tutors will also encourage and support parents and carers to help pupils with numeracy learning at home.

Main responsibilities:

- To undertake group numeracy teaching in one or more of our partner schools.
- To encourage and facilitate parent/carer engagement with NumSkills.
- To report on individual pupil progress.
- To work as part of the Quest for Learning tutor team.

Duties:

- To teach two or more groups of pupils in school, comprising twelve 45minute sessions per group across each 6-week block.
- To take responsibility for group teaching, keep detailed records of each child's progress, and produce reports for Quest for Learning, the partner school, and parents/carers.
- To work in partnership with each child's parents/carers, encouraging and supporting numeracy learning at home.
- To work closely with class teachers to identify initial learning needs and to regularly update them on pupil progress.
- To participate in Quest for Learning tutor team meetings and collaborate with the monitoring and evaluation requirements for funded work.

About you

We're looking for enthusiastic and experienced individuals who are committed to the aims and ethos of Quest for Learning and have experience of working with primary-aged children in an educational setting. If you're passionate about improving the life chances of disadvantaged children through education and have the drive and initiative to work with minimal supervision, we would love to hear from you.

Successful candidates will be required to undertake NumSkills and Generalist Safeguarding training prior to commencing teaching, and to undergo an enhanced DBS check.
